The historiography of the modern Mediterranean is fragmented into separate histories of port cities, nation-states and areas. The aim of this workshop is to fuse these histories by focusing on Mediterranean connections during the modern imperial age. During this period empires and nation-states linked and penetrated the Mediterranean area in a much more intense way than ever before. How were islands, port cities and regions influenced by this process? How did they contribute to the creation of empires and nation-states? By analyzing these modern connectivities of the Mediterranean, we hope to contribute to a re-mapping of the area, and to a more integrated view of this global contact zone between Europe, North-Africa and the Middle East.
