# Urban refugees in Kuala Lumpur: living a life in limbo

**Lecture by Gerhard Hoffstaedter** (University of Queensland)

Malaysia houses the largest urban refugee population in Southeast Asia. Mainly ethnic minorities from Myanmar seek protection in Malaysia, which is not a signatory country to the UN refugee convention or protocol. Everyday realities for refugees are dictated by class and ethnic identity as refugees seek to make a life for themselves and their families in legal limbo. Ethnographic material from Rohingya, Tamil and Chin communi-

ties will illustrate the contradictions and minor realities refugees carve out for themselves in spite of insufficient support and often debilitating

rent-seeking.
