This paper will focus on two spaces of social marginality in Beirut: the Friday Market in Sin Al-Fil and the Sabra market in the Palestinian camp of Sabra-Chatila. It will analyze the issue of socioethnic stigmatization in relation to the social composition of the sellers and buyers, and how this stigmatization is reflected in the media. It will also deal with the roles of these markets as gates of the city and as places of consumption for a population on the urban fringe.

Franck Mermier is an anthropologist, director of research at the Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique (Institut Interdisciplinaire d'Anthropologie du Contemporain, EHESS-CNRS, Paris). He obtained his Ph. D. in Anthropology in 1988 (Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales, Paris) and a HDR Accreditation to supervise research in 2010. He was the Director of the French Center for Yemeni Studies in Sana'a from 1991 to 1997. From 2005 to 2009, he held the post of Director for Contemporary Studies at the French Institute for the Near East (Beirut). He published in 2015 the book *Récit de villes: d'Aden à Beyrouth* and in 2010 *Mondes et places du marché en Méditerranée. Formes sociales et spatiales de l'échange* (co-edited with Michel Peraldi), Paris, Karthala/CJB/IFPO, as well as *Mémoires de guerres au Liban* (1975-1990) (co-edited with Christophe Varin), Arles, Actes Sud.
