The Zentrum Moderner Orient is dedicated to historical, social and cultural research on the Middle East, Africa, Central Asia, South and Southeast Asia. The central research programme »Muslim Worlds -World of Islam? Concepts, Practices and Crises of the Global« (2008-2019) aims at investigating a broad spectrum of historical and contemporary dynamics within and between predominantly Muslim societies since the eighteenth century, and their links with Europe. Research is characterised by a combination of inten-te sive archival work and field research based on the knowledge of a multitude of regional languages. The cooperation of historians, anthropologists, economists, area and religious studies specialists as well as experts from other disciplines transcends the standard disciplinal and regional fields of knowledge. Beyond that several cooperative projects exist with other institutions and the ZMO hosts a number of researchers from different international research programmes.

In January 1996, the Centre became part of the Verein **Geisteswissenschaftliche Zentren Berlin e.V.** (GWZ), whose members include the three Berlin Universities and several research institutions. The recurrent budget of the Centre is provided by the State Government of Berlin, while the research projects are primarily funded by the Federal Ministry of Research.

The **ZMO library** is closely linked to the Centre's research programme and currently holds approximately 50,000 volumes and 90 periodicals and serial publications. The material can be used in the reading room, copy facilities are available (see http:// www.zmo.de/ biblio/main.htm for lending conditions).

The Centre invites both German and foreign colleagues to discuss their research at a series of public lectures every last Thursday in the month.
