



Translocality: An Approach to Globalising Phenomena?

Tenth Anniversary Conference
Zentrum Moderner Orient, Berlin
September 26-28, 2006

The conference takes as its vantage point ZMO's thematic focus on African and Asian societies and cultures. It aims at exploring a variety of approaches and processes which are connected to globalisation from different disciplinary perspectives. The conference will contribute to the ongoing critical discussion of globalisation by focusing on the often ignored agency and perception of actors from the South. Attempts to cope with this challenge both conceptually and methodologically have created a new attention to migration, diaspora, transnationalism, cosmopolitanism and transculturation, but also to the limits and regulation of flows inherent in globalisation. Using the concept of translocality, ZMO has made a specific contribution towards a better understanding of the complexity of globalising processes. Translocality here serves both as a research perspective and as concept to grasp particular empirical realities. Each of the conference sessions assembles a number of case studies from different regional and disciplinary angles which relate to a particular set of translocality-related concepts. This allows for systematic comparisons and the testing of different theoretical approaches. The papers are not read individually but summarised and commented upon by a discussant.
