

The 1990s were a period of intense political activism in Kenya. The Moi regime found itself beleaguered. Together with other opposition forces, Muslim activists mounted a direct challenge. Their political activism led to repression which in turn led many to leave. The result has been communities of Muslim exiles in Canada, Britain and the US.

Mohamed Bakari is a Kenyan Professor who teaches in the Department of English Language and Literature at Fatih University of Istanbul. He also taught at the University of Nairobi and was a Visiting Fulbright Scholar at the University of California Los Angeles. He has published numerous works in the areas of linguistics, African languages and Islam in East Africa, such as Islam in Kenya (Nairobi 1995) and The morphophonology of Kenyan Swahili dialects (Berlin 1985).
